READING RANGERS!



Dear Pine Ridge Families:

In conjunction with our PRR (**P**ine **R**idge **R**angers showing **P**ride, **R**espect, **R**esponsibility) initiative, we are excited to announce the kick-off of our Reading Rangers program! We already have an amazing group of readers at Pine Ridge, but we want to help everyone continue to grow as readers. It is important for each of us to set a personal reading goal, and the Reading Rangers program can be one way for readers at every level to accomplish just that.

Here's how it works...

- Each student in 2nd-4th grade will be given a Reading Rangers board with different kinds of reading material listed in each square. (A copy of the board is on the back of this paper.)
- For every completed square, students will turn in a Reading Ranger Card to Mrs. Zietz telling about their favorite part of the book. (Reading Ranger Cards can be found in the media center.)
- Students will earn a sticker on their reading board for each completed square. We will also
 display their name on a Ranger in the media center for the first completed square; after that,
 stickers will be added to their Ranger for each completed square.
- Prizes for completing rows on the board are listed on the back of this paper.
- Students are encouraged to use the Reading Rangers board all year long and try to complete as many squares and rows as they can.
- We will keep students' Reading Rangers boards in the media center. You can track their reading progress at home with the copy of the board on the back of this paper.

We hope to see our Pine Ridge Rangers show their **PRIDE** in our school and themselves by **RESPECT**ing books and being **RESPONSIBLE** students who set a reading goal and reach it! Please do what you can to encourage your child to read each and every night!

Rules:

- Books can only count for one square at a time.
- Books do not have to come from our school media center.
- For every book you complete, you must turn in a Reading Ranger Card telling Mrs. Zietz about your favorite part of the book. You will receive a sticker in the square to show you completed it.

Rewards:

- Your name will be displayed on a Ranger in the media center after you complete your first square. A sticker will be added to your name for every additional square you complete.
- Completed rows will be rewarded as follows:
 - ✓ 1st row: Extra book check out
 - ✓ 2nd row: "Reading Rangers!" pencil
 - ✓ 3rd row: Reading Rangers bracelet AND hear your name read by Mrs. James over the announcements
 - ✓ 4th row: Free book AND hear your name read by Mrs. James over the announcements.
 - ✓ 5th row: Be a library helper during your class library time. (You get to check out books!) AND hear your name read by Mrs. James over the announcements.
